


BIA Route 7 to US HWY 83 Improvement Project, Phase 1 Rosebud Sioux Tribe, KLJ, and Loiseau Construction


The Rosebud Indian Reservation, in Todd County, SD, is home to the Rosebud Sioux Tribe (RST). The tribal headquarters, located in Rosebud contains a Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA) Route 7. This is a vital arterial corridor that spans from Rosebud to US Highway 83.

The roadway was in extremely poor condition. Travelers and workers experienced transportation challenges including limited visibility, lack of transportation access, and constrained transportation options. The area also experienced a high crash rate on the unsafe corridor.

As a result, the corridor needed to be reconstructed. But the RST did not have the financial means to fund the \$14.2 million project. Working closely to understand the project's full magnitude and impact on the region, KLJ prepared a dynamic grant application package seeking a Transportation Investment Generating Economic Recovery (TIGER) grant from the USDOT to reconstruct the essential roadway.

For more than eight years, KLJ helped RST secure the necessary funding and provided design and construction support for this vital infrastructure project.

Black Hills Chapter

Middle school Mathletes® from 5 western South Dakota schools took part in the Black Hills MATHCOUNTS competition on Saturday February 25th at the SD Mines campus. The students competed in 3 intense rounds of written exams followed by a head-to-head, beat-the-buzzer math battle for a chance to go to the state competition in Pierre. This years top team was the Hawks from Southwest Middle School in Rapid City followed closely by the Governors from Georgia Morse Middle School in Pierre. The overall top individual was Christian Stanley from Georgia Morse Middle School. Wyatt Boerger from Southwest Middle School placed second as an individual and won the Countdown Round Competition.

Twelve students earned the right to advance to the state competition in Pierre on March 11th. Southwest Middle School students - Wyatt Boerger, Cohen Griffin, Michael Schnee, Matthew Stagner, Yedam Na, Dane Walker, and Owen Lin coached by Crystal McMachen; Georgia Morse Middle School students - Christian Stanley, Noah Lueking, Gemma Stangeland, and Rylan Afdahl coached by Jason Stangeland; East Middle School student Taylor Elder coached by Jeremy Reeve.


