MONTHLY MEETING SUMMARY BY ROUZBEH GHABCHI

A Laboratory and Field Study of Engineered NMAS Superpave Mixtures of the City of Sioux Falls

South Dakota State University (SDSU)

The need for an economically feasible, reliable, sustainable, constructible, and resilient transportation system is becoming increasingly evident due to shrinking budgets, expanding demand, capacity limitations, evolving environmental standards, and resource constraints. Improved pavement preservation techniques and optimized engineering parameters are the principal starting point for addressing the preceding needs. An expanded toolbox of pavement designs, materials, and engineered solutions is necessary for meeting these challenges. Given the size and impact of the Sioux Falls metropolitan, the City of Sioux Falls (CSF), the largest urban area in the Dakotas, is facing these challenges on a much larger scale. Therefore, Sioux Falls is the ideal crucible for expanding and developing the tools necessary to meet the foregoing challenges. A core of older infrastructure in the central areas of the city, as well as an ever-expanding need for resilient infrastructure development on its periphery, amplifies the scale of the challenge but also multiplies the benefits of a multifaceted toolbox approach to pavement maintenance, preservation, engineering standards, and holistic pavement selection criteria for new and reconstructed facilities.

To respond to this need and gain a clear picture of asphalt mix properties, different tests capable of characterizing rutting, fatigue cracking, low-temperature cracking, and moisture-induced damage potential should be conducted. In close collaboration with the Dakota Asphalt Pavement Association (DAPA), the research team at SDSU has proposed developing a toolbox of different Thin-Lift Overlay (TLO) options for the CSF. To this end, it is proposed to conduct Hamburg wheel tracking, semicircular bent, tensile strength ratio, 4-point flexural beam, disc-shaped compact tension test, Texas overlay test, and indirect tensile asphalt cracking test following AASHTO T 324, ASTM D 8044, AASHTO T 283, AASHTO T 321, ASTM D7313, TEX-248-F, and ASTM D8225 standard methods, respectively. Test results will be analyzed, and the effectiveness of using polymer-modified asphalt (PMA), highly polymer-modified asphalt (HiMA), reclaimed asphalt pavement, and fiber-reinforced asphalt concrete (FRAC) in TLO mixes used by the CSF to minimize pavement distresses in overlay projects will be determined. More specifically, the effects of utilizing PMA, HiMA, FRAC, and RAP in TLO mixes on their resistance to rutting, cracking, and moisture-induced damage are proposed to be studied. In addition to laboratory tests, pavement sections are proposed to be visited periodically, and any signs of pavement distress at each test section will be documented. This presentation will summarize the proposed work and the related ongoing efforts.


